We have continued our learning around the poem 'The Owl and the Pussycat' this week. We have changed lots of aspects of the story (such as the characters and the food that is eaten) to make it our own version and next week we will begin to write the narrative using our innovated ideas,

In maths we have been busy comparing numbers to 20 using the language 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to', and we have order numbers from smallest to greatest and greatest to smallest. We have also been learning about time, focusing on o'clock. The children have been practising reading times on analogue clocks. We have used practical activities, clocks and games to help the children become more confident in recognising and telling these times.

In our topic lessons we have been learning about the artist L S Lowry, who was born in the Victorian times, We have used his famous matchstick people style art to draw our own playground scene.

We had a fantastic Science Day in Leopard Class. This year's theme was curiosity, and the children spent the afternoon thinking and working like scientists. We talked about how scientists ask questions, explore ideas and investigate the world around them. The children visited different science stations and explored how birds' beaks are suited to different foods, built their own clay reptiles and sorted animals into groups. The children showed great curiosity, asked thoughtful questions and enjoyed investigating together. It was a great afternoon!
