Welcome back! We hope that you had a lovely Easter break.

In our English lessons this week, we have been reading the story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We have loved finding out about the tiger and writing descriptive sentences to describe his looks and personality.

In maths we have been using our knowledge of number bonds to 10 to work out the number bonds to 20, and we have been practising finding doubles. 'Hit the button' is a really good interactive game to help us with this and if you would like to play this game at home, click on the link below:

We have also been learning to recognise different coins and understand their values. We practised sorting coins, matching them to amounts and combining them to make totals. We used fun "shop" activities to help apply this learning in real-life situations. You can help at home by letting your child handle coins and practise making small amounts.

We have started our new topic 'Save our Seas' by creating super pieces of 'under the sea' artwork using wax crayons and paint. The children should have brought home a copy of the POWER projects but it is also on Google Classroom for you to see.

This week in science, the children have been learning about the features of a fish. We explored how fish have gills to help them breathe underwater, fins to help them swim, and scales to protect their bodies. The children also discussed how these features help fish survive in their habitats.
