In our English lessons this week, we have been learning the story of 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' off by heart using actions and story maps to help us. We have also been practising writing question sentences as well as pretending to be Sophie and writing in our diary about the day the Tiger came.

In maths we have been using our knowledge of number bonds to help us solve subtraction sentences. For example, if we know that $8 - 5 = 3$, we can use this to work out that $18 - 5 = 13$. We have also been learning to recognise and name different coins and notes. We explored their value and took part in fun activities such as matching games and a "fastest finger first" challenge to identify coins and notes quickly. The children also enjoyed using money in role-play activities to practise real-life skills.

In our 'Save our Seas' topic, we have been learning about the 5 oceans of the world – we have been learning a song to help us remember all the names. Click on the link if you would like to practise this at home! [Five Oceans Song](#).

In Science this week, the children have been learning about mammals and their offspring. We explored what makes an animal a mammal and learned the names of different baby animals, such as puppy, kitten, calf and lamb. The children enjoyed matching adult animals to their babies and talking about how mammals care for their young.
