



Leopard Class Newsletter



In our English lessons this week, we have been analysing the structure of 'the Tiger Who Came to Tea' by 'boxing-up' the key elements of the story. We have also started to think about our own version of the story by making up our own alliterative title. For example, 'The Bear Who Came to Breakfast' or 'The Leopard Who Came to Lunch'.

In maths we have been writing addition and subtraction facts using part whole-models, and we have been exploring how to find the difference between 2 numbers using counters to help us. We also recapped recognising and naming different coins and notes, exploring their value and key features. We then began counting money, with a focus on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s to help add amounts more efficiently. The children's confidence has grown so much when working with money!

In our 'Save our Seas' topic, we have been learning about the 4 countries that make up the United Kingdom, and the 4 seas that surround the UK. We also looked at some of the animals that you would find in these seas.

This week in science, we learned about one of our Star Scientists, Prem Singh Gill. The children enjoy finding out how scientists help us understand the world around us.

We have also started our new topic on plants and their parts. We explored the difference between wild and garden flowers and went on an exciting hunt outside to find and observe them. The children showed great enthusiasm and curiosity while exploring nature!
