In English lessons this week, we have been thinking in more detail about our made-up sea creatures. We have decided where they are going to live, what they are going to eat and a fascinating fact about them. We have also learnt how to use the conjunction 'because' in a sentence and how to use adverbials such as 'amazingly', 'interestingly' and 'surprisingly' at the start of a sentence.

In maths, we have using base-10 to help us to find 1 more and 1 less than a number, and we have started learning to count in steps of 2, 5 and 10.

We have started our new topic 'Our Local Area' this week. The POWer projects have been sent home with the children and a copy is also on Google Classroom.

In Science, we have been learning about deciduous and evergreen trees. We sorted different trees into these groups and discussed the differences between them. We also enjoyed exploring the school grounds to look at trees outside, where we identified some common tree names and observed their leaves. The children were excited to become young tree experts!

In RE, the children have been thinking about the groups they belong to, such as their family, class, clubs and community groups. We discussed why these groups are important and how being part of a group can help us feel included, valued and supported.
