In English lessons this week, we have been continuing to write our innovations of our sea creatures including using adverbials such as 'surprisingly' 'amazingly' and 'incredibly' and using conjunctions such as 'because'. We have written about what they look like, where they live, what they eat and interesting fact about them, They have all worked really hard on this well done!

In maths, we have been learning how to recognise equal and unequal groups by creating different groups of counters and then finding out how many we have altogether using our learning of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We have also learnt how to add equal groups and have started to look at making arrays.

In our topic lesson this week, we started our new topic 'our local area' and looked at different types of maps including a treasure map. We then followed a route around the school and discussed names of different directions. We then drew out the route from leopard class and identified the route using a key.

In RE this week, we continued exploring the question, "What does it mean to belong to a Faith Community?" We identified symbols and special objects that show belonging and discussed how everyone has things that reflect who they are and what is important to them. The children then enjoyed creating "identity glasses" to represent their own sense of belonging and values.
