Dear Parents and Carers

This week we have enjoyed the stories *The Big Red Bath* and *Rainbow Fish*. Our rhyme of the week was *1,2,3,4,5 Once I Caught a Fish Alive*. In our maths we were thinking about sharing out a number of objects (dividing) and our word of the week was share.

On Tuesday morning we had a visit from two local Police Officers, PC Smith and PCSO Partridge and they showed us their Police Car. We all liked the lights and sirens! They then came into nursery and showed us all the things they have to wear or carry as part of their uniform. PC Smith then talked about keeping safe when crossing the road. She talked about the importance of holding an adults hand when near the road. She then kindly gave us some reflective stickers and zipper pulls to help keep us safe at night.





This week we also made carrot and coriander soup for snack. We chopped carrots, leek and potato before cooking it with pepper, coriander and vegetable stock. This is a really easy soup to make and the recipe will be on *Google Classroom* this week.

Next week our story of the week is *The Twinkly Nativity*. Our words of the week are *Jesus* and *birthday*. Our rhyme of the week is *I'm a little snowman*. In our maths we will be thinking about the past and future.

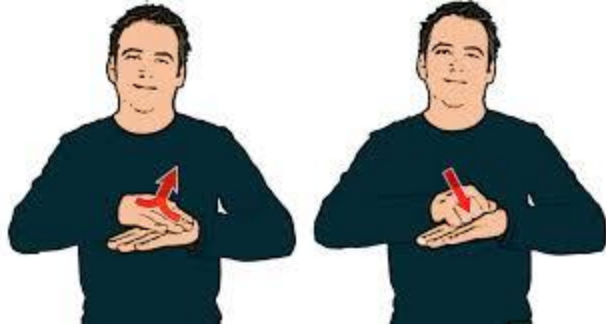
