In English we have started our new unit of work based around the story of 'The Gruffalo' by Julia Donaldson. The children have enjoyed learning of the story off by heart by following a story map and they have written some fantastic sentences describing what they can see in a picture.

In Maths, we have learnt to write number sentences where the = sign is at the start, for example $9 = 4 + 5$, and we have discovered that from one part-whole model, you can write 4 addition number sentences. These are called 'Fact Families'. We have also started learning about 'mass'. We have been focusing on using the words 'heavier' and 'lighter' when comparing the mass of different objects. Following this, we measured the mass of different objects using cubes.

In our topic lessons we have learnt that the world is split into 7 continents. To help us remember the names, we have enjoyed learning a catchy song. If you would like to sing this song at home, please click on the link below.
