In English this week we have started to innovate (change) the story of 'The Gruffalo' to make it our own version. We have changed the main character, the setting and the other characters that our main character meets along the way.

In Maths, we have continued practising our number bonds working systematically so that we don't miss any out, We have also continued our learning about 'mass'. We have been focusing on comparing the mass of different objects by looking at how many cubes different objects weigh and explaining how we know which is the heavier or lighter object. Towards the end of the week, we started learning about 'capacity' and 'volume'. We used vocabulary such as: full, empty, nearly full, nearly empty and half full. We will continue this next week.

In Science, we focused on our sense of touch. There were different objects hidden inside feely bags and we had to use our sense of touch to try and guess what each object was!

In our topic lessons we have been learning about the Inuit culture and how they have adapted to live in such cold and harsh conditions.
