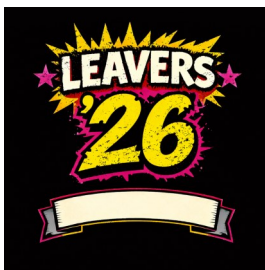

ONLINE SAFETY INFORMATION SESSION

We are pleased to be able to inform parents/carers/grandparents (anyone who would like to know more about keeping children safe online!) that we will be hosting an online safety information session on Tuesday 7th July at 6pm-7pm. The lead for internet safety for West Mercia Police will be there, along with John Finch Computers, our IT providers. Refreshments will be provided by our Governors and a free creche for any parents who can't get childcare. There will be a presentation and then a Q & A session. JFC are also happy to speak personally to anyone at the end if they have any specific issues they need help with e.g. Physically showing you how to add parental controls etc.

Although it is being hosted at Tenbury Primary, we are pleased that we are able to work together with Burford Primary as well and invite their parents, to really try and keep our whole local community safe online.

REGAL TENBURY WELLS SUMMER SCHOOL

The Regal Theatre Summer School is a 19-day holiday programme for children aged 9-15, combining drama, arts and crafts, and cinema in a fun, supportive environment. WATER SAFETY ADVICE

In times of extremely high temperatures, there is an increased likelihood of children and young people seeking to cool off in rivers, lakes, quarries and other open water locations.

Schools have been encouraged to remind pupils and families of the dangers associated with open water swimming and other water related activities during periods of hot weather.

Key messages to remember:

- Risk of drowning increases by 70% when temperatures exceed 30 degrees
- Open water can be deceptively dangerous, even for confident swimmers
- Cold water shock can affect anyone, regardless of age or swimming ability.
- Hidden currents, sudden drops, submerged objects and poor water quality can present serious risks.
- Inflatables should never be relied upon in open water and can quickly drift into dangerous situations

Teachers have also put water safety activities into their Google Classrooms, to further help support this message.
